In the first semester of 2024, ENLENS approved four new projects. These projects cover a variety of subjects related to energy transition, such as sustainable value chains, green hydrogen projects, lithium mining, water desalination, CO₂ capture and utilization, just transition, and access to energy. The projects contribute to advancing progress, primarily in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-Being), SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), SDG 7 (Affordable and Clean Energy), SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure), SDG 13 (Climate Action), and SDG 15 (Life on Land).
